# LGBTQ(QIP2SA+) – say **WHAT?**

*An introduction to the many ways of being human*

**Saturday, March 1, 2025**

9 am – noon

St. John's Episcopal Church

Many of us grew up in a time or place where it was just taken for granted that every girl would marry a boy. If “gay” or “lesbian” was mentioned at all, it was with disapproval; none of us knew anyone who was “transgender.” But the world, and our understanding of human biology, has changed - leaving many of us confused about what the ever-increasing alphabet soup stands for, or why it matters, or how to relate to our family, friends or fellow church members who identify differently.

This special workshop, limited to members of the Episcopal churches of St. John the Baptist (Lodi) and St. Anne's and St. John the Evangelist (Stockton) and their friends and family members, will fill in the gaps about such things as:

- What are all those initials for?
- At what age do people realize they are different?
- What should you say if someone comes out to you?
- Why do most LGBTQ+ persons feel endangered in the U.S. today?
- Why do some people prefer pronouns other than “she” or “he”, and what should you do if you accidentally use the wrong one?

The program is designed to be a safe space to learn and explore via presentations, interactive breakout sessions, sharing of some personal stories, and time for questions and conversation.

The workshop is FREE (\$10 per person freewill donation suggested to help cover expenses).

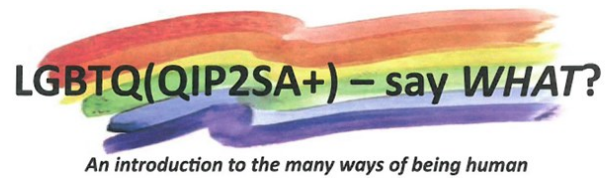

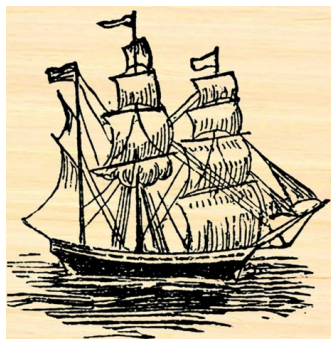

## *Rector Reflections*

---



Did you know that the place where the congregation sits during church is called the “nave?” The word nave comes from same origin as the word naval – as in a ship. If you look up in many traditional churches, in our nave here at St. John’s, or especially in the nave of our Historic Chapel, you will see what looks like the hull of a ship turned upside down.

People use ships to move from one place to another through the unpredictable and turbulent waters of the ocean. When there is calm, we can rest upon the deck allowing the gentle rocking motions and the warm sun to nourish and refresh us. When the storms come, the ship provides shelter down below keeping us from the wind, rain, and waves. Throughout it all, the ship’s wheel and rudder keep us going in the direction we hope to go and the sails, filled with wind, push us forward. Nothing on a ship is static. It is constantly moving, rocking, and bobbing.

The same elements are true in a church from the nourishment we receive in the calm, the safety from the storms, and the never-ending forward movement, being pushed, pulled, and steered along by God, Christ Jesus, and the Holy Spirit.

Like a ship on the sea, our relationship with God is never static. It is always moving, rocking, and bobbing. It is easy to allow our daily lives to steer us off course, so we return to church for a course correction, to find calm within the unpredictable and turbulent waters of our lives.

As we enter March, this year, we also enter Lent. Lent provides us a unique opportunity to lean into this dynamic relationship we have within the heart of the Trinity. It reminds us not to leave the rest, safety, and guidance we find in church behind when we walk through the doors. All of this is available to us in every moment of our lives whether we are in church, home, work, or the grocery. As we access it, we are called to then share it with others.

As we enter Lent, we will take on practices to strengthen our relationship with God (self-examination, repentance, prayer, fasting, self-denial, reading, or meditation). These practices look different from person to person, because we all have a unique relationship with God. Whatever practices you observe during Lent, allow them to nourish your relationship with God and bring you closer to the knowledge that whether in church or in the world, you are held in safety and being nourished in God’s embracing arms as we move forward, building the Kingdom God envisions for us here on earth as it is in heaven.

And still to dust and ashes you return.  
But Hope could rise from ashes even now  
Beginning with this sign upon your brow.*

## *From You Senior Warden*

---

*Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways submit to Him, and He will make your paths straight. –Proverbs 3:5*

Nearly every Saturday since the 2020 pandemic shutdown, I chat via FaceTime with my father in Baltimore and two of my brothers, who live in Alabama. We are a mixed bag of religious practice: my father has been a Catholic deacon for 40+ years; one brother is a lay minister at a Jesuit college; the other is a Methodist, and I round things out as the rogue Episcopalian.

We spend an hour with personal updates, commentary on the week's news, and respective weather reports. As is the case with many conversations these days, talk turns to how our churches and congregations are discussing and responding to the varied hopes, concerns and questions sparked by not only recent national events, but also crises like the devastating fires in Southern California.

My father made a comment the other day that resonated: that we are being tested, and that God is calling to the faithful to trust him. I wondered what fosters that trust, and what it might look like.

Cultivating trust in each other, I'm convinced, signals our trust in God. How are we doing this? Let me count the ways:

- Through our fellowship at events like Coffee Hour, where we listen with care and compassion.
- By serving with and for each other at our monthly Soul Kitchen, teaching little ones in the Nursery, keeping the church grounds healthy and tidy, serving side by side at The Salvation Army dining hall, planning and operating events large and small, keeping the kitchen going, preparing the church itself for services, and extending our ministry to our various committees.
- While sitting with each other during challenging times.
- And reaching for each other's hands during The Peace.

Every time we connect, we build trust. Trust that we can see and hear each other. Trust that we can lean on each other. And trust that each and every one of us is valued.

## St. John's Upcycle Sewing Workshops

Creation Care continues to work towards reducing plastic waste in our environment. The Bags to Benches effort continues, thanks to parish donations of clean plastic bags and mailers. The collection bin is stationed, at the ready, in the narthex.

To further reduce single-use plastics in our everyday lives, Creation Care is pleased to announce **Upcycle Sewing Workshops at St. John's**. Stitchery talents will be needed to create reusable produce bags made from unwanted fabric. The project will reduce both plastic and fabric waste in landfills. Transforming one scrap at a time for new purpose is one way to – *upcycle!* The free produce bags will be passed out at the Lodi Thursday Farmers' Markets, beginning this spring. ## **Parochial Report for Tidings**

Each year, we are canonically required to submit a document called the “Parochial Report.” This document tracks each parish’s health through a reporting of various means for the prior year (Average Sunday Attendance, Pledges, Finances, Membership, etc.). However, as we all know these numbers don’t accurately reflect the true “health” of a church. A church’s vitality is much more than the number of people sitting in the pews.

Recently, The Episcopal Church started asking questions that really get to the heart of a church’s impact. This year, we were asked how many people we interact with through our ministries beyond Sunday, how we are engaging with the care of our creation, and what gifts we bring to our community and how are we leaning into those gifts.

It was a joy to fill out these sections. Through our Sunday services (both in person and online), noonday prayer, compline, pastoral visits, feeding ministries at Hope Harbor and Soul Kitchen and our December toy distribution, we impact on average 394 people per week in the Lodi community. This number does not account for our efforts at Pride and Love Lodi, which we intend to track in 2025.

Beyond these efforts, we also host a variety of fundraisers throughout the year which attract people outside our community. The engagement with our community and recognition of our gifts and how we use this is a much better measure of the health of a church. Reporting those numbers and offering descriptions of our gifts and how we impact God’s Creation, allowed us to see on paper how much we matter to the community around us.

Thank you to everyone who gives of your time, treasure, and talents to make St. John’s a vibrant place that not only enhances our lives, but also the lives of those who live in Lodi and the surrounding communities.
